Anyone can be a victim of sexual assault, relationship violence, or stalking. If a situation doesn't seem right to you, it probably isn't.

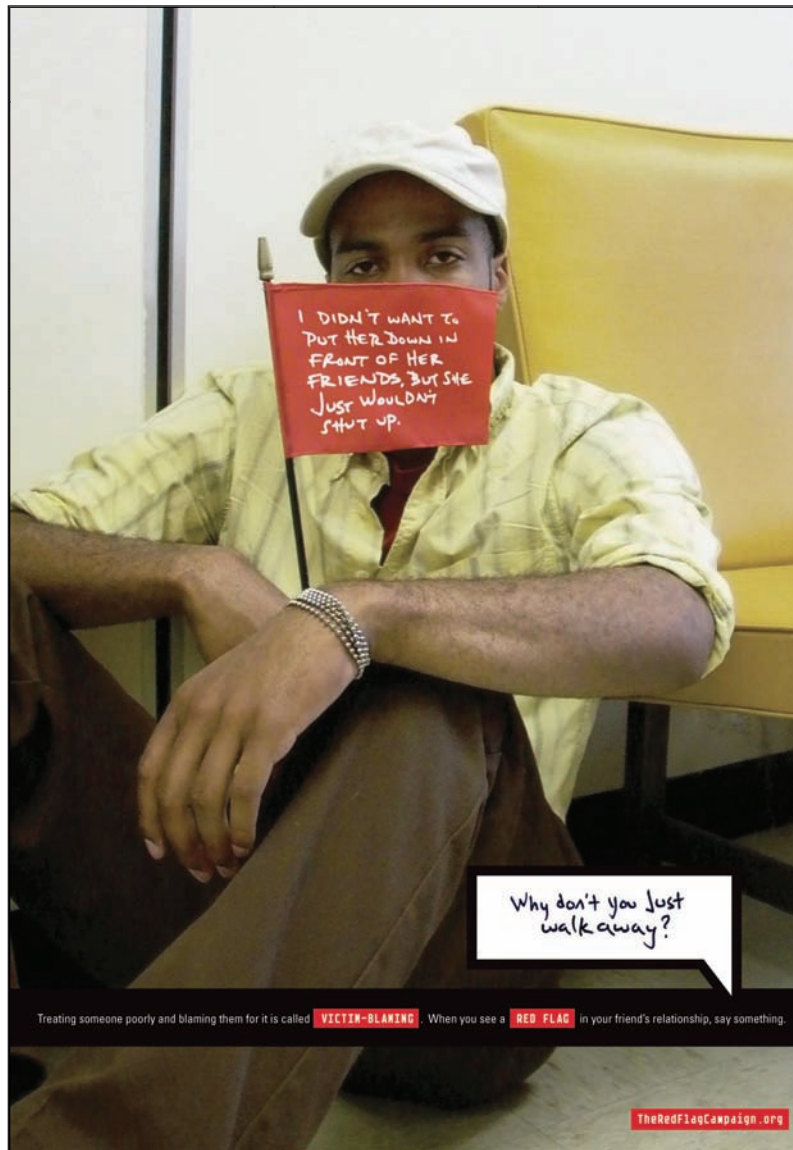
Red flags are what prompt you to say something or do something when you or a friend are in a situation that is uncomfortable, whether it be with a stranger or someone you know.

The Wellness Resource Center can help sexual assault survivors identify existing needs and determine the most appropriate campus and community services.

VCU's Sexual Assault & Relationship Violence Services Coordinator, Tammy McKeown (828-2085) is available to provide advocacy and meet individually with survivors of sexual assault, relationship violence, stalking, and sexual harassment. She serves as a resource to students, faculty, and staff.

VCU is committed to providing quality services to students who experience sexual assault, relationship violence, and stalking. Services can be obtained anonymously, are confidential and are available to survivors and their families, significant others, and friends.

We are honored to be the two trained VCU student advocates supervised by the Coordinator of Sexual & Relationship Violence Services. We are more than happy to help advocate on behalf of students experiencing sexual assault, intimate partner violence or stalking.

A unique part of our positions is that we provide crisis intervention, hospital accompaniment, and court accompaniment to students who need those services. We can come to your residence hall or

other VCU building to meet with you.

We are also able to provide referrals and resource information for service on and off campus. We are on-call throughout the weekends during the school year from Friday at 3 pm to Monday at 7 am.

If you need us, please contact us through the VCU Police or the VCU Residential Life and Housing staff. They will be able to give you the number to the on-call cell phone. We are happy to help, so please do not hesitate to contact us!

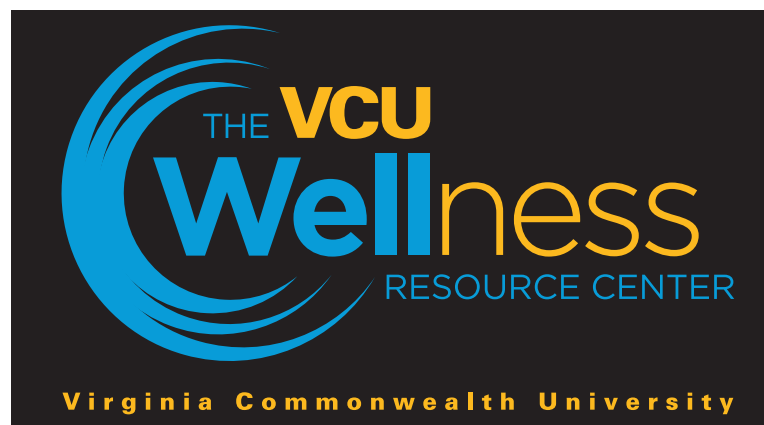
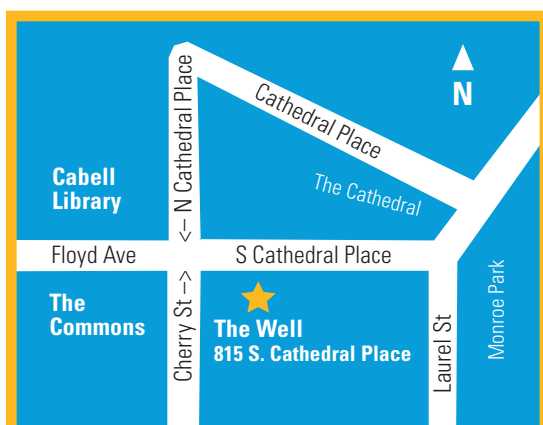
